Instructions and Goals

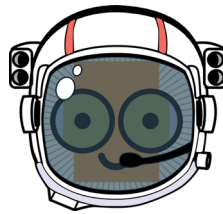

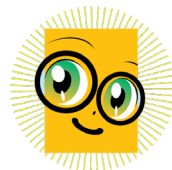

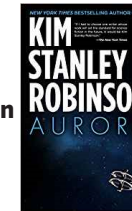
