














What is Chronicling America?

- 30 languages




Chronicling America: Dates (1736-1963)





Research Tips

Historical Vocabulary/Spellings

- Browse the newspapers to learn what terms were used at the time
- Women's rights v. Suffrage
- Airplane v. Aeroplane

Outdated Language

- Neutral and other terms may have been used in the past
- Filling Station v. Gas Station
- Colored v. Black or African American

Research Tips

Establish context

- Newspaper articles came from a particular time and place in history
- Consider what was happening during that time and if any of that could relate to the newspaper article, potential bias, or how people/events were portrayed.
- Check for newspapers written for and by various ethnic or labor groups involved in the stories being covered.

Read additional articles

- Stories develop over several days
- Some newspapers publish weekly
- Seek articles from different newspaper titles/publishers

Read the title essay

- Newspapers have a title history essay
- Essay provides publisher, audience, community context
